This 26 day expedition will return to Aotearoa/New Zealand to immerse students in the landscapes and cultures of this truly remarkable and stunning country. Students will be actively engaged in Maori Studies programs through Te Puna Wanaka of CPIT and a multi-day experience at Waikawa Marae. Experience Aotearoa/New Zealand's most important natural treasures, its stunning landscapes and waters of Te Wai-pounamu, the South Island, through an 8 day backcountry traverse of Kahurangi National Park including 5 days trekking rugged peaks & 3 days 'source to sea' wilderness whitewater rafting and 4 days sea kayaking in Abel Tasman National Park. Through these wilderness experiences, students will gain a deep understanding and appreciation of each region we travel and the connection of that place to New Zealand culture. Expedition theory, local and global recreation resource management issues, outdoor technical skills, local and global service learning initiatives, learning exchanges with CPIT students & faculty, and direct contact with a diverse cross-section of New Zealanders including indigenous Maori are all integrated into this active experience. This will be ASU's first carbon neutral/offset international travel program, which is an exciting and important reflection on our commitment to global environmental issues and sustainability initiatives.
